ABOUT US

The Catholic University of Malawi is a fast-growing and dynamic institution of higher learning accredited by the National Council for Higher Education (NCHE) to offer Degrees, Diplomas and Certificates. It was established by the Malawi Conference of Catholic Bishops (MCCB) formerly known as Episcopal Conference of Malawi (ECM) on October 16, 2004.

The University started admitting students in 2006 and was officially opened on October 28, 2006 by the late President Bingu wa Mutharika.

It has seven faculties, namely Commerce, Education, Law, Nursing and Midwifery, Science, Social Sciences and Theology. Since its establishment, the University has grown its student body from 129 in 2006 to 6000-plus in 2024.

The Catholic University has held twenty-three congregations.

The University has an affiliation agreement with the Inter-Congregational Institute (Balaka), St. Anthony Major Seminary (Kachebere-Mchinji), and St. Peter's Major Seminary (Zomba).



ADMISSION POLICY

The Catholic University of Malawi is open to students of all faiths and respects freedom of thought and expression within the Catholic ethos.

ELIGIBILITY

Applicants must have MSCE or its equivalent, plus credit in six subjects including English and an aggregate score of not more than thirty (30) points and obtained in not more than two sittings in the recent past three years.

The University also considers those with other Advanced/higher certificates and diplomas from approved and accredited institutions in relevant areas of study. Faculties vet each candidate on a case-by-case.

ENTRY ROUTES & REQUIREMENTS

The University has three entry routes for its undergraduate programmes. Requirements of each entry route are as follows:

1

ROUTE 1: ENTRANCE EXAMINATION

A. Malawi School Certificate of Education/ Equivalent. Six credits passes including English and an aggregate score of not more than thirty (30).

For Bachelor of Laws (Hons), applicants must have an aggregate score of not more than twenty (20) points.

IGSCE and O-Levels with the following interpretation: IGSCE on an 8-point scale of grade (A*=1; A=2; B=3; C=5; D=7; E=8; F & G=9). O-Level on a 5 point scale of grades as follows: A=1; B=3; C=5; D=7; E=8.

B. "A" Level Qualification

Candidates with A-Level qualification must have a minimum of three principal passes with an aggregate of at least 9 points. Interpretation is as follows: A= 5; B= 4; C=3.

ROUTE 2: BRIDGING

The Bridging Programme is aimed at providing academic study opportunity to those who do not meet the prescribed University normal entry requirements.

ROUTE 3: ADMISSION THROUGH CONSIDERATION OF ADVANCED CERTIFICATES

The University also considers those with other Advanced/higher certificates and diploma from approved and accredited institutions in relevant areas of study.

Faculties vet each candidate on a case-by case basis.

Such candidates are not required to write University Entrance Examinations (UEE).

CENTRES

The Catholic University established three centres as instruments for strengthening organizational learning and fostering meaningful contribution to society. The following are the centres in operation:

Centre for Socio-Theological Studies

Established in May 2009, the Centre for Socio-Theological Studies aims to provide high-quality short courses on socio-theological issues of national importance.

Its goal is to foster the ongoing education and formation of pastors, priests, religious leaders, laypeople, and those implementing faith-based socio-economic programs. The specific objectives of the Centre are as follows:

A. To provide ongoing formation for priests, pastors, and religious leaders on socio-theological issues, equipping them with the knowledge and skills required to address the challenges of the 21st century.

B. To offer formation in the Christian faith to laypeople and other Church collaborators involved in health, education, social justice, and development programs.

C. To provide thought leadership on matters concerning the interaction between the timeless Word of God and the evolving human condition.

Centre for Environmental Affairs

The Centre seeks to respond to the cry of the earth by promoting intellectual and cultural habits consistent with the ethics of integral ecology. It takes Pope Francis' encyclical *Laudato Si'* (2015) as its Magna Carta.

The Centre's operations are also guided by the United Nations' Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) enunciated in 2015, especially SDG 6 (clean water), SDG 7 (clean energy), SDG 12 (responsible consumption), SDG 13 (climate action), SDG 14 (life under water), and SDG 15 (life on land). Malawi's grand strategy, dubbed Malawi 2063 – inspired by the African Union's Agenda 2063 – also identifies environmental sustainability as one of the enablers for Malawi's

vision of attaining an inclusively wealthy and self-reliant nation by 2063.

Among the specific objectives of the Centre for Environmental Affairs are the following:

A.To spearhead reflection on the interplay between the nation's development agenda and environmental sustainability.

B.To conduct and publish research on issues relating to the environment.

C.To lobby, through various fora, for legislation that fosters the ethics of integral ecology.

D.To engage the business community in charting a path toward sustainable business practices.

E.Act as an Information Service Centre and in-house resource centre for use by interested parties in all areas of environmental studies and natural resource management.

Centre for Research and Publications

One of the principal mandates of institutions of higher learning is research and the dissemination of knowledge through publication. The Centre for Research and Publications is thus tasked with the responsibility of promoting, facilitating and coordinating research initiatives both within the institution and in collaboration with other stakeholders. One of the outlets for research work is the Southern African Journal of Contemporary Studies, an inter-disciplinary publication. Further, a publications and innovation gallery has been created as a privileged space for exhibiting works published by the University's staff.

Management Resource Centre

The Centre acts as a central resource for students and faculty within the Faculty of Commerce, providing support for both academic and professional growth in management-related areas. It offers workshops and seminars on topics such as leadership, entrepreneurship, and project management, among others.

FACILITIES

The university has twenty-six classrooms, three Lecture Theatres, one Assembly Hall, three ICT Laboratories, one Physics and Pedology Laboratory, one Biology and Chemistry Laboratory, one Geography Information System (GIS) Laboratory, one Nursing and Midwifery Skills Laboratory.

Library

To maintain its stand as centre of excellence in providing quality education, the University has 30921 up-to-date books in its magnificent library. The University has also subscription to MALICO, West Law JSTOR, and many other reputable journals.

Clinic

The clinic, certified by Medical Council of Malawi, has four beds. Any serious illness is referred to the nearest hospital, namely St. Joseph Hospital (Nguludi).

Student Accommodation

The University has hostel blocks which can accommodate up to 816 students. Besides, a number of hostels have been constructed around the campus by landlords other than the University. Currently, there are high standard accommodation facilities for over 1000 students within and around Montfort Campus.

Catering

Catering services are outsourced from professional and vetted catering companies.



Security

The University has access to security services from a near by police unit, two hundred metres away from the campus. The university also outsources security services from a private company whose personnel are on and around the campus 24/7.

FACULTIES

The University has seven faculties.

FACULTY OF COMMERCE

The Faculty of Commerce is an academic division within our university that specializes in the study of business, trade, finance, and management. It offers a diverse range of undergraduate programmes designed to equip students with the theoretical knowledge and practical skills necessary for successful careers in the corporate sector, government, and entrepreneurship.

The Faculty has five programmes: Accountancy, Banking and Finance, Business Administration, Human Resource Management, and Marketing.

Bachelor of Commerce (Accountancy)

The Bachelor of Commerce in Accountancy is a four-year undergraduate programme that offers students a solid foundation in accounting principles, financial management, taxation, auditing, and business laws. This program prepares students for careers in accounting, finance, and related fields, and serves as a stepping stone toward obtaining professional qualifications both in Malawi and internationally.

The programme is offered to both Generic and Weekend students. In the generic mode, the programme is offered during weekdays. In the Weekend mode, the programme is offered during weekends, prefaced by a two-week intensive learning period at the beginning of each semester.

Normal Entry Qualifications

- Malawi School Certificate of Education (MSCE) or its equivalent with credit in English language /literature plus a grade of not more than 4 in Mathematics.
- The overall grade should not exceed 30 points in the best 6 subjects.
- Candidates must have passed The Catholic University of Malawi entrance examinations or must have successfully completed the Bridging programme offered by the university.
- Candidates with A-Level certificates in relevant subjects are exempted from taking the entrance examinations.

Mature Entry Qualifications

- Malawi School Certificate of Education (MSCE) or its equivalent.
- ICAM diploma or ACCA skills level (up to F6).
- CAT/ FIA with skills level 1 (i.e. from F1 to F6).
- Completion of ACCA professional stage.

Careers:

Chartered Accountant or Certified Public Accountant (after professional certification), Auditor, Tax consultant or advisor for businesses and individuals, financial analyst or corporate treasurer in medium to large organizations, Commercial or investment banker, Credit or risk analyst, Loan officer or relationship manager in banks and microfinance institutions.

Bachelor of Commerce (Banking and Finance)

The Bachelor of Commerce in Banking and Finance is a specialized four-year undergraduate degree program that offers students comprehensive knowledge of the banking and financial sectors. This program is designed to establish a solid foundation in economic principles, banking operations, investment analysis, and risk management. It prepares students for dynamic roles within the financial services industry.

Normal Entry Qualifications

- Malawi School Certificate of Education (MSCE) or its equivalent with credit in English language /literature plus a grade of not more than 4 in Mathematics.
- The overall aggregate for the MSCE certificate should not exceed 30 points in the best 6 subjects.

Mature Entry Qualifications

- Advanced level candidates must have academic credentials such as certificates and diplomas obtained from recognized professional bodies, and such candidates are admitted in second year for those with relevant Diplomas, and third-year for those with relevant Advanced Diplomas.

Careers:

Commercial Banker, Investment Banker, Credit Analyst or Loan Officer, Branch or Operations Manager, Financial Analyst, Portfolio or Fund Manager, Stockbroker or Trader, Risk Manager, Corporate Treasurer Finance Officer or Manager, Business Development or Strategic Planner.

Bachelor of Commerce (Business Administration)

The Bachelor of Commerce in Business Administration is a four-year undergraduate programme that emphasizes the principles and practices of business management. This program is designed to provide students with a solid foundation in business operations, strategic planning, leadership, and organizational behavior. It prepares graduates for managerial and administrative roles in a variety of industries.

Normal Entry Qualifications

- Malawi School Certificate of Education (MSCE) or its equivalent with credit in English language /literature plus a grade of not more than 4 in Mathematics.
- The overall aggregate for the MSCE certificate should not exceed 30 points in the best 6 subjects.



Mature Entry Qualifications

- Applicants with a credit pass in Association of Business Executive Advanced Diploma (Level 6), Advanced Diploma in Human Resource Management, Advanced Diploma in Logistics, Procurement and Supply Chain Management, Advanced Certificate in Accounting from any approved Qualification Body within Malawi or outside Malawi.
- Qualification with professional accredited bodies will be admitted to the programme this qualification will supersede the requirements for MSCE on case consideration.

Business Development Manager, Operations Manager, Project Manager, General Manager or Executive Trainee, Organizational Development Specialist Compensation and Benefits Analyst, Marketing Executive or Sales Manager or Account Executive, Brand Manager.

Bachelor of Commerce (Human Resource Management)

The Bachelor of Commerce in Human Resource Management is a comprehensive undergraduate programme that combines core business principles with specialized knowledge in managing people within organizations. This degree equips students with the skills to attract, develop, and retain talent, while aligning HR strategies with overall business objectives. The programme runs for four years to completion.

Normal Entry Qualifications

- Malawi School Certificate of Education (MSCE) or its equivalent with credit in English language /literature plus a grade of not more than 4 in Mathematics.

- The overall aggregate for the MSCE certificate should not exceed 30 points in the best 6 subjects.

Mature Entry Qualifications

- Advanced level candidates must have academic credentials such as certificates and diplomas obtained from recognized professional bodies, and such candidates are admitted in second year for those with relevant Diplomas, and third-year for those with relevant Advanced Diplomas.

Careers:

HR Officer/Manager, Talent Acquisition Specialist, Compensation and Benefits Analyst, Employee Relations Specialist, Learning and Development, Corporate Trainer, Organizational Development Specialist.

Bachelor of Commerce (Marketing)

The Bachelor of Commerce in Marketing is a dynamic undergraduate programme designed to develop strategic, analytical, and creative skills essential for success in today's competitive business environment. The four-years degree integrates foundational business knowledge with in-depth marketing expertise, preparing students to understand consumer behavior, develop effective marketing strategies, and drive business growth.

Normal Entry Qualifications

- Malawi School Certificate of Education (MSCE) or its equivalent with credit in English language /literature plus a grade of not more than 4 in Mathematics.

- The overall aggregate for the MSCE certificate should not exceed 30 points in the best 6 subjects.
- Applicants with a credit pass in Association of Business Executive Advanced Diploma (Level 6), Advanced Diploma in Human Resource Management, Advanced Diploma in Logistics, Procurement and Supply Chain Management, Professional Diploma in Marketing (CIM-UK) from any approved Qualification Body within Malawi or outside Malawi, who also meet the MSCE qualification criteria detailed above.

Bachelor of Education (Biblical & Religious Studies)

Bachelor of Education (Biblical & Religious Studies) offers quality and holistic education in the preparation of adequately and professionally qualified Bible Knowledge, Religious and Moral Education teachers for secondary schools and colleges, as well as researchers in matters pertaining to religions, culture and the environment in Malawi. The other aim is to contribute to the integral development and unity of the Malawi nation through professional training, academic courses and research activities in religions, religious co-existence, and environmental management.

Entry Requirements

- Applicants with six credits in MSCE including English and either Bible Knowledge or Religious and Moral Education or their equivalent.
- To the three-year programme, applicants with a grade 'A' in Bible Knowledge or Religious Education in A-level examinations or their equivalent.
- To the two-year programme, applicants with a diploma from a recognized college or institution with an average grade of credit in either Religious or Biblical Studies.

They are to be morally exemplary persons, able to work effectively with minimum supervision and with a strong team spirit.

Bachelor of Special Needs and Inclusive Education

- Candidates in possession of Malawi School Certificate of Education or its equivalent must have credit passes in 6 subjects including English and with aggregate points of the best six subjects not exceeding 30 shall be considered for admission into the Programme, after excelling in the University entrance examinations.
- Those with lesser credit pass in four or more subjects but with aggregate points below 34 shall be considered for admission after undergoing through Bridging Programme.
- Candidate with advanced certificated and/or diploma in special needs education obtained from an accredited institution shall also be considered for direct admission as 15 mature students and shall be exemption in some courses at the discretion of the Department.

Diploma In Special Needs & Inclusive Education (Social Studies)

Entry Requirements

- A candidate with Malawi School Certificate of Education or its equivalent with credit passes in 6 subjects including English shall be eligible for admission into the programme.

Bachelor of Social Science (Economics)

The degree programme in economics is aimed at providing training for students in the various branches of the economics discipline. Economics helps solve issues people face in their everyday lives. Economics students explore decisions that directly affect their lives and the people surrounding them. Students studying economics will be challenged to find solutions to current macroeconomic issues such as unemployment, poverty, low economic growth, inflation, and overuse of natural resources.

Entry Requirements

- Applicants into the economics programme must be holders of Malawi School Certificate of Education (MSCE) or its equivalent with six credits including English plus a grade maximum of 4 in Mathematics. The overall aggregate should not exceed 30 points in the best 6 subjects obtained in not more than two sittings.

Bachelor of Social Science (Monitoring and Evaluation)

This programme enables students to attain and apply practical and advanced skills to monitor, evaluate and manage different challenging projects in a dynamic and fast changing field of social sciences and other disciplines or organizations. The programme exposes and provides students with modern tools and best practices for project/programme managing such as project ethics, statistical computer packages and approaches of planning, designing, data collection, data analysing, cleaning and reporting for effective formulation and implementation of evidence-based interventions.

Entry Requirements

- Applicants must be a holder of Malawi School Certificate of Education or its equivalent with six credits including English and Mathematics obtained in not more than two sittings (with a maximum average of 30 points). A 2-year Diploma in Monitoring and Evaluation or any other related field from a reputable and recognized institution of higher learning.

Monitoring & Evaluation Officer / Specialist, Project/Programme Officer, Learning & Accountability Officer, Research & Impact Assessment Officer, Donor Reporting Officer – **Preparing progress reports for organisations like USAID, DFID, UNDP, UNICEF, and World Bank**, Planning, Monitoring & Evaluation Officer – Working in ministries (Education, Health, Agriculture, Local Government), District M&E Officer – Coordinating monitoring systems at council level, National Statistics & Planning Agencies – **Supporting surveys and impact assessments (e.g., Malawi NSO)**, Public Policy Analyst – **Using M&E data to influence policy development and decision-making.**

Bachelor of Social Science (Political Science)

The Bachelor of Social Sciences - Political Science programme is designed to train high-level graduates who, upon graduation, can contribute to development by being critical and effective citizenry. It encourages citizens to uphold principles of good governance whilst participating in matters of national interest and beyond. Bachelor of Social Sciences - Political Science programme focuses on equipping students with a solid theoretical background in Political Science who can effectively contribute to discussions and debates on matters of national interest.

Entry Requirements

- Applicants must be a holder of Malawi School Certificate of Education or its equivalent must have credit passes in 6 subjects including English and with aggregate points of the best six subjects not exceeding 30 shall be considered for admission into the Programme, after excelling in the University entrance examinations.
- Candidate with advanced certificate and/or diploma in Political Science obtained from an accredited institution shall also be considered for direct admission as mature students and shall be exemption in some courses at the discretion of the Department.

Policy Analyst or Advisor, Civil Servant or Administrative Officer, Legislative Assistant or Parliamentary Researcher, Diplomatic Service Officer, Programme Officer or Coordinator, Advocacy and Campaign Manager, Humanitarian Affairs Specialist – **working with organizations like the UN, AU, or SADC**, Political Campaign Manager or Strategist, Public Opinion or Polling Analyst.

Political Consultant, Political Researcher or Think Tank Analyst, Lecturer or Tutor (**with postgraduate study**), Public Policy Researcher.

Bachelor of Social Science (Social Work)

The aim of the programme is to prepare practitioners committed to social justice and serving and empowering individuals, families and communities. It contributes to the development and dissemination of social work knowledge and skills and affirms professional values and ethics. Graduates are prepared to be committed to diversity, social and economic justice, the promotion of community well-being, and the interdependence of local and global issues.

Entry Requirements

- Applicants into the Social Work programme must have a Malawi School Certificate of Education (MSCE) or its equivalent, with credits in English Language and Mathematics, and an aggregate of not more than 30 points in the best 6 subjects.

Careers:

Social Worker, Community Development Officer, Child Welfare or Protection Officer, Family Services Worker, Medical or Hospital Social Worker, Mental Health Counselor, Substance Abuse Counselor, Disability Support Coordinator, School Social Worker, Youth Development Officer, Programme Officer or Coordinator, Human Rights Advocate, Disaster Response or Relief Worker, Social Policy Analyst, Probation or Parole Officer, Welfare Officer.



Diploma in Adult Education and Development

The Diploma in Adult Education and Development programme was created to prepare adult education practitioners to become effective and independent professionals. Graduates will be equipped to make strategic decisions regarding facilitation, materials, assessment, and programme selection. They will also apply advanced skills in learner support and engage with local contexts and policy developments.

Entry Requirements

- Malawi School Certificate of Education or its equivalent with six credits (with a maximum aggregate of 34 points) including English.
- An experienced field worker linked to adult education with a progressive working experience of not less than three years.

Careers:

Adult Literacy Instructor, Adult Education Facilitator, Curriculum Developer, Community Development Officer, NGO Program Officer, Community Mobilizer, Corporate Trainer or Skills Development Officer, Vocational Education Instructor, Human Resource Development Assistant, Adult Education Officer, Extension Worker.



Diploma in Monitoring and Evaluation

The Diploma in Monitoring and Evaluation was designed to stimulate interest in the collection of information through monitoring activities and processes of particular projects, analyzing the data, and evaluating the results in order to improve service delivery.

It helps students to make sense of a complex and dynamically changing world. It explains how service delivery is planned, designed, executed, implemented, monitored, and the expected results are evaluated. Fieldwork is an essential element of this. Students learn to think critically about how to design, develop and use various monitoring and evaluation systems, toolkits, methods and techniques to achieve successful implementation of programmes and projects.

Entry Requirements

- Applicant must be a holder of Malawi School Certificate of Education (MSCE) or its equivalent with 5 credits including in English and Mathematics.
- Diploma in any field of social sciences or its equivalent from an accredited, reputable and recognized institution of higher learning.

Careers:

M&E Officer/Assistant, Program Officer with M&E Focus, Data Analyst or Research Assistant, Monitoring and Evaluation Officer, Policy and Planning Officer, Project Coordinator.



THE FACULTY OF THEOLOGY

The Faculty of Theology consists of two departments: the Department of Biblical and Religious Studies (BRS) and the Department of Philosophy. Additionally, the faculty includes the Centre for Socio-Theological Studies, which addresses relevant issues affecting society and religion.

The faculty is also affiliated with two institutions that offer the Philosophy Programme. These institutions are the Queen of the Apostles, Inter-Congregation Institute (ICI) in Balaka and St. Anthony's Kachebere Major Seminary in Mchinji. After a three-year study, candidates from these institutions are awarded a Bachelor of Arts in Philosophy.

St. Peter's Major Seminary in Zomba offers a Bachelor of Arts in Theology to all successful candidates upon completion of a four-year study program. Through the academic training provided at St. Anthony's Major Seminary and St. Peter's Senior Seminary, the Catholic University of Malawi plays a vital role in preparing future indigenous clerics and religious missionaries of the Franciscan Capuchins for Malawi.

At the ICI in Balaka, several congregations, including *the Missionaries of Africa* (formerly known as the *White Fathers*), *Montfort Missionaries*, *Comboni Missionaries of the Sacred Heart*, *Pallotine Missionaries*, and *Discalced Carmelites*, benefit from the university's services.

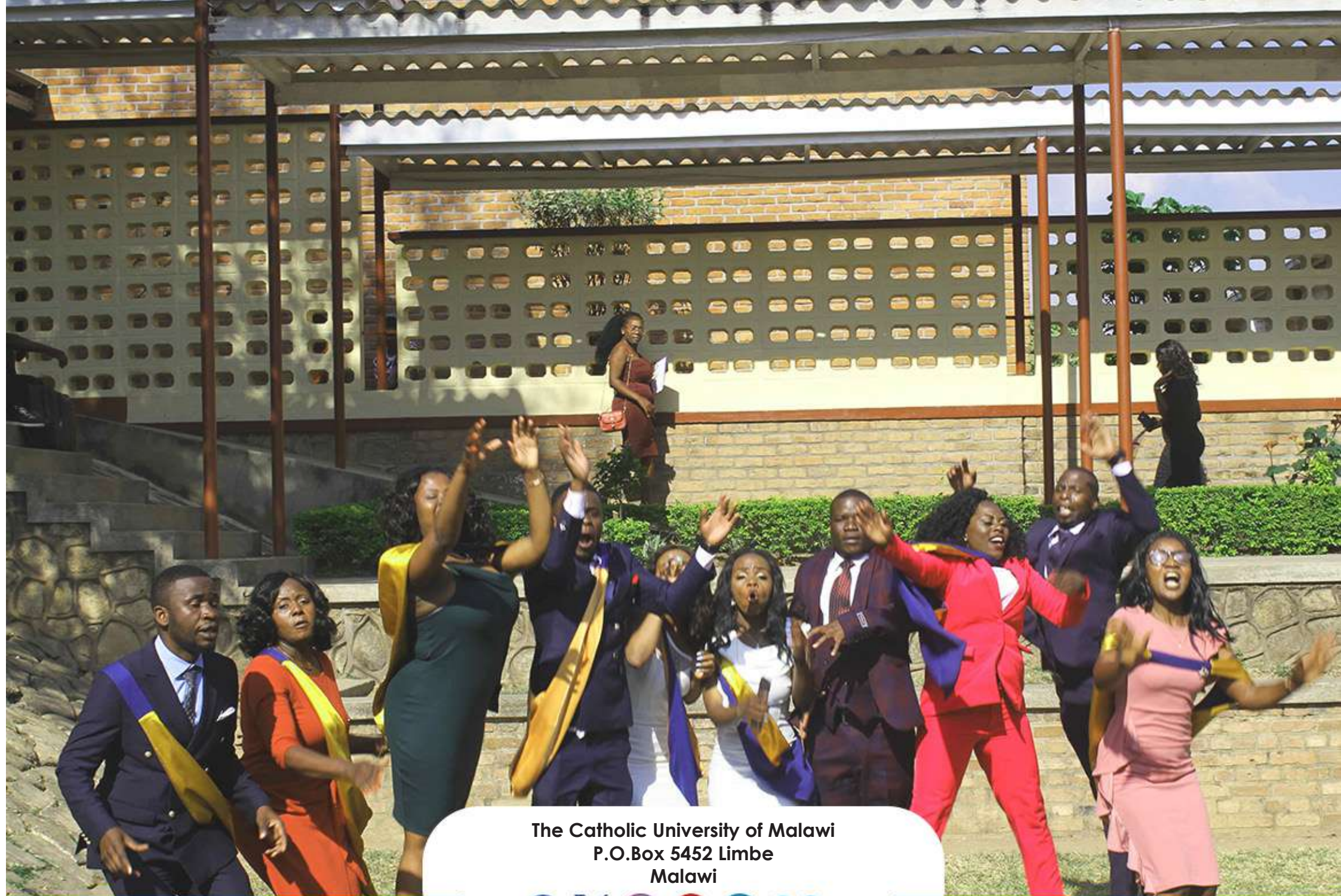
CATHOLIC UNIVERSITY MUSLIM STUDENTS ASSOCIATION (CUMSA)
